

What NOT to say during death notification:

- Do not say "lost", "passed", "deceased" when referring to the person who has died
- · I know exactly how you feel
- · Time heals all wounds
- · You'll get over this someday
- · You must go on with your life
- · He didn't know what hit him
- · You must focus on your precious memories
- . It's better to have loved and lost, than never to have loved at all
- · It must have been his/her time
- · Someday you will understand why
- · God must have needed an angel
- · God never gives us more than we can handle
- · Only the good die young
- · You'll get through it, be strong
- · Everything happens for a reason, life goes on

What TO say during death notification:

- · Identify who you are
- · Confirm that you are talking to the right person
- · Confirm their relationship to the deceased person
- . Be clear and direct about the loss of life
- · Give the person time to process after hearing this difficult news
- · When referring to the deceased use their name
- Ask if there is a faith leader, family member, or friend you can contact to be with them.
- Bring that trusted person to them when they arrive
- · Give your grief material and your Contact information
- If available share case # of ID.

Suggested Script:

I'm afraid I have some very bad news for you. Your cousin/son/parent,

has been involved in a serious vehicular crash/shooting and he/she has died. (Pause) I am so very sorry.
